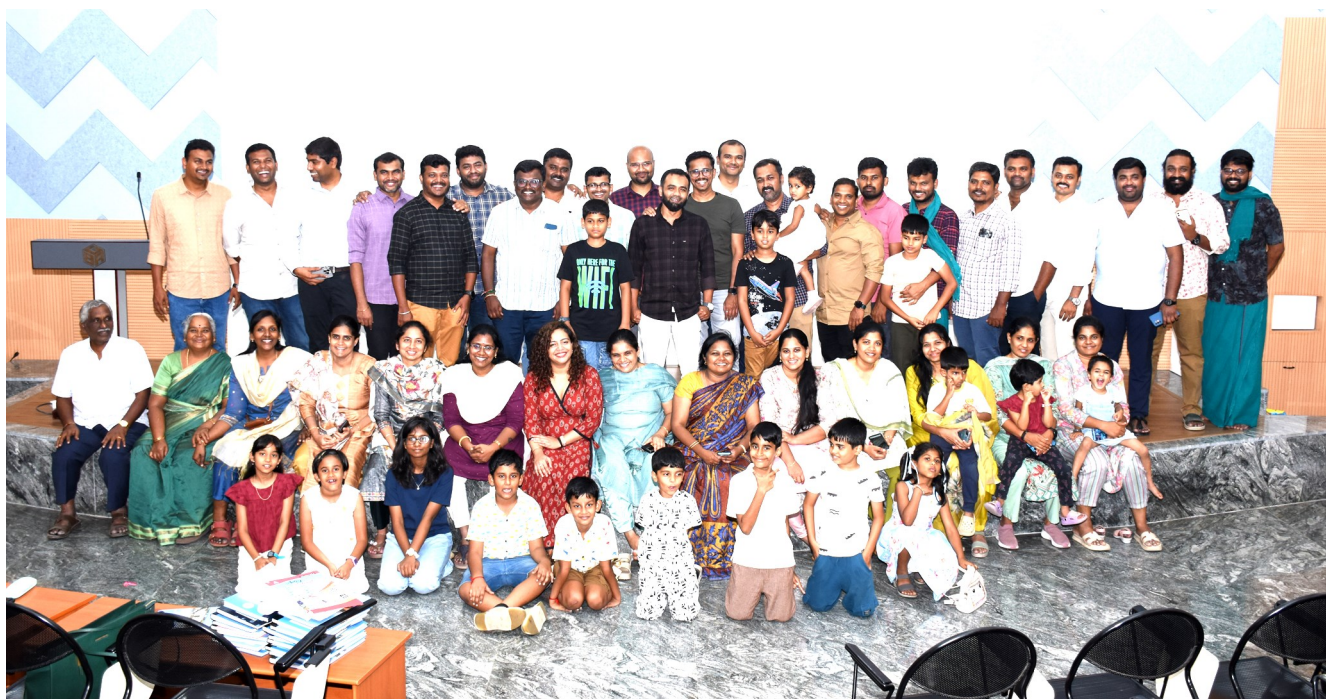
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ALUMNI GET-TOGETHER – 2010 BATCH, DEPARTMENT OF TEXTILE TECHNOLOGY

The alumni also had an engaging interaction with the Alumni Coordinator on various initiatives aimed at strengthening the alumni–



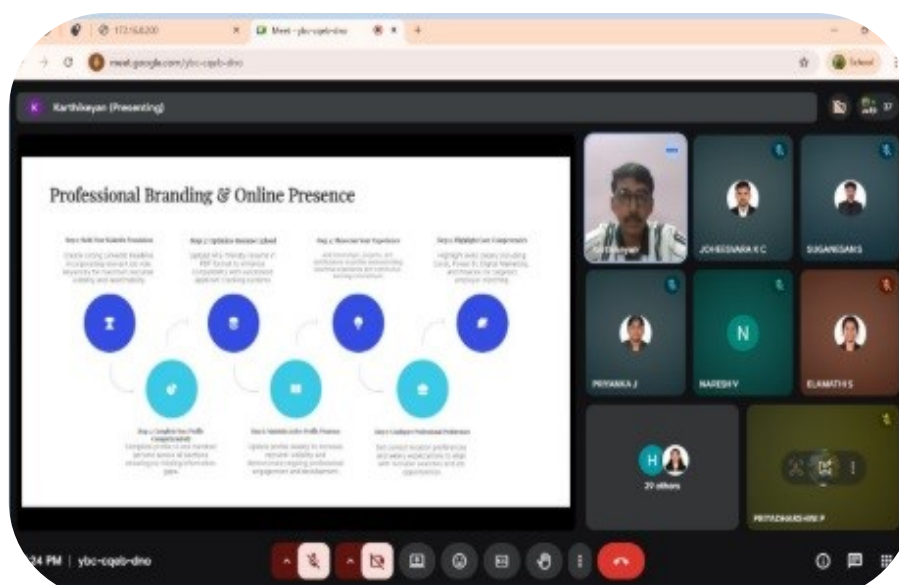

Alumni Interaction Meet – School of Management Studies

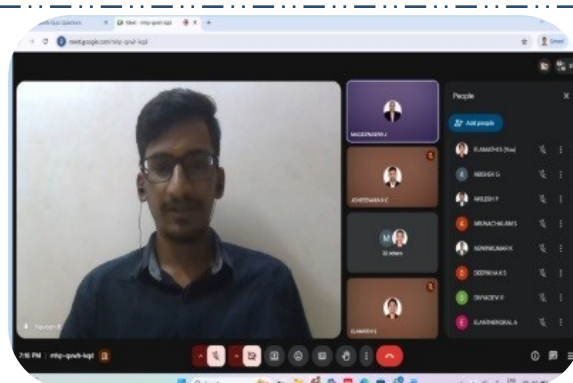

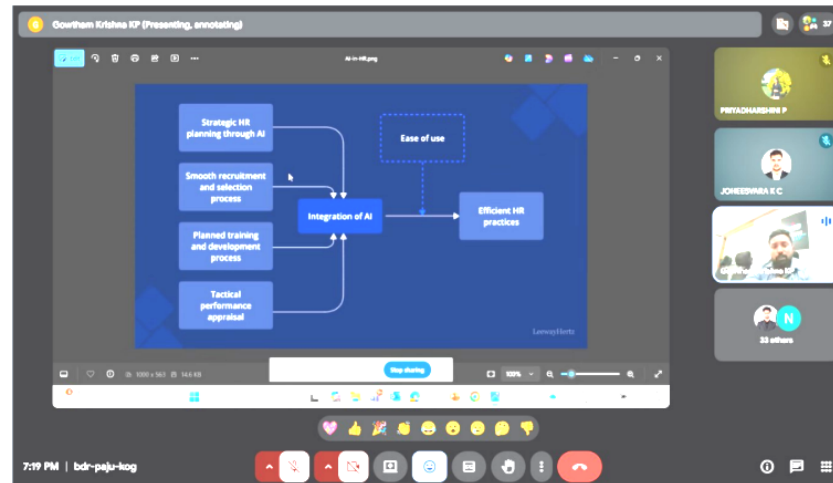
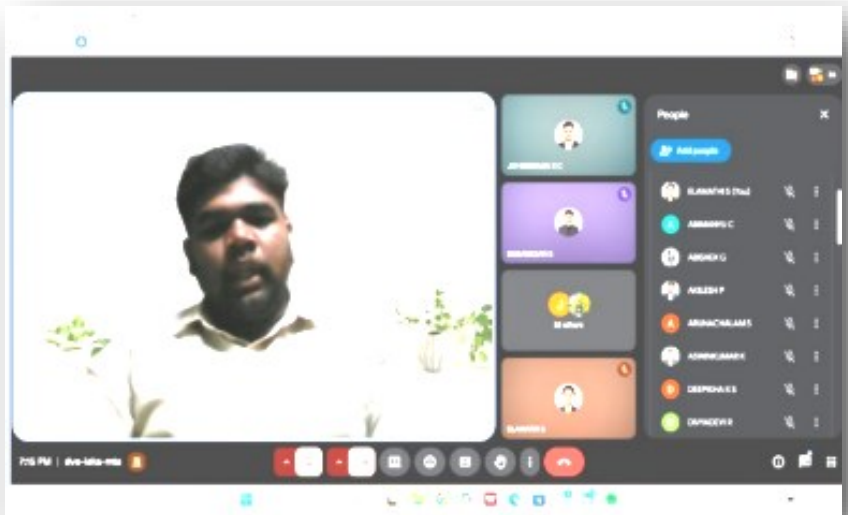
Catalysts of Success: The Must-Have MBA Toolkit

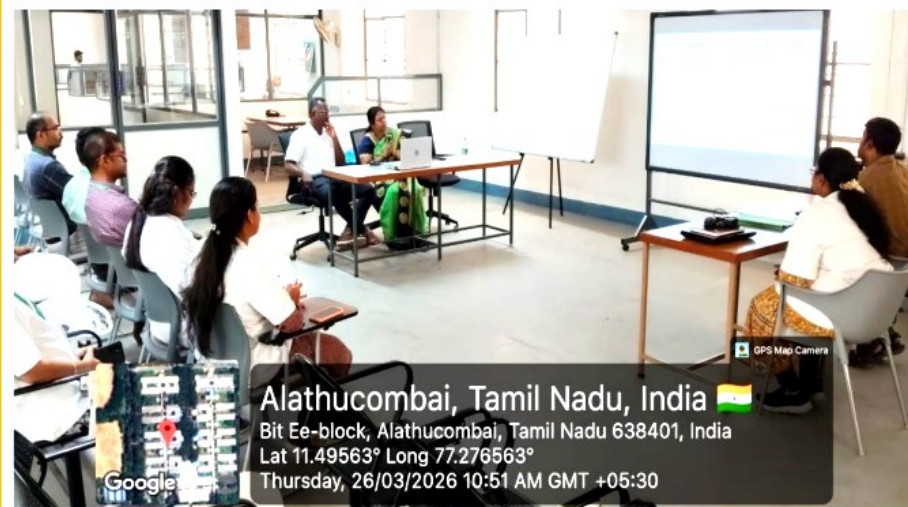
Alumni Participation in Board of Studies Meeting

Alumni Interaction with IECC Cell on Emerging Technologies and Student Development

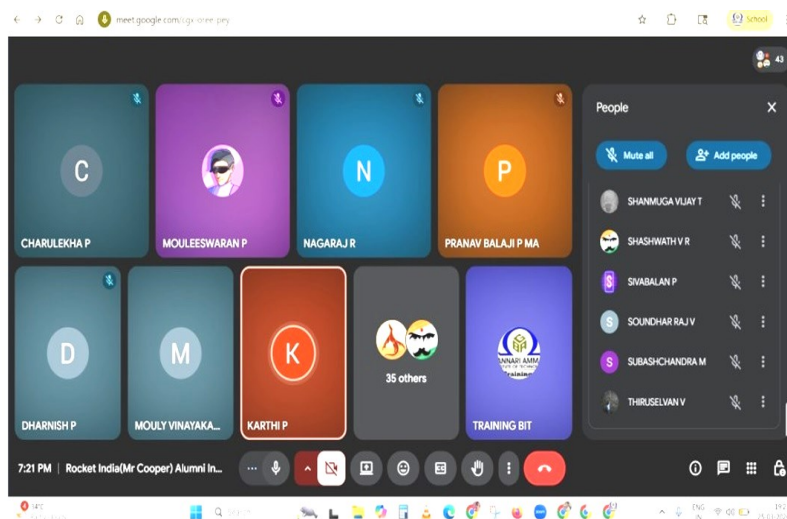
