3.8	<p>A Student may be permitted to credit <b>two online</b> courses with the approval of the Departmental Consultative Committee constituted by the Head of the Department, subject to a maximum of <b>6 credits</b>. The Head of the Institution shall form a 3 member committee with one of the members as HoD and two senior faculty members to ensure that the student has not studied such courses and would not repeat it again as Professional Core/Professional Elective/Open Elective courses. A student can get <b>exemption for a maximum of 6 credits</b> during the entire programme (in lieu of core elective or open elective). These online courses shall be chosen from the SWAYAM platform, provided the offering organization conducts regular examination and provides marks. The credits earned shall be transferred and the marks earned shall be converted into grades and transferred, provided the student has passed in the examination as per the norms of the offering organization</p>	<p>A Student may be permitted to credit <b>three online</b> courses with the approval of the Departmental Consultative Committee constituted by the Head of the Department, subject to a maximum of <b>9 credits</b>. The credits earned shall be transferred and the marks earned shall be converted into grades and transferred, provided the student has passed in the examination as per the norms of the offering organization.</p>
