Salient Features of Autonomous System

The Bannari Amman Institute of Technology (BIT) has been conferred with the Autonomous Status by the University Grants Commission, New Delhi, with effect from the academic year 2007-2008 , subsequently extended up to 2019-2020. Under this system, the Institution has a great deal of freedom to design and deliver outcome-based curriculum to suit the needs of students as well as requirements of the other stakeholders.

Salient features of the Autonomous System of BIT are:

- BIT adopts Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) with Outcome Based Education (OBE) as per the guidelines of the UGC, NBA and Anna University.
- Choice Based Credit System enables the students to acquire Knowledge, Skills and Attitude (KSA) and learn the courses at one's own pace as prescribed in the regulations and curriculum.
- Fast Track System enables the students to undergo a semester- long Internship or Special Training.
- Board of Studies in each discipline of study has representation from members of faculty of Department, University, Industry, Students, Alumni and Research Organizations. Board facilitates the innovative curriculum, on par with other higher education institutions, with well-defined Programme Educational Objectives (PEOs), Programme Outcomes (POs) and Assessment Methods.
- Core electives, Open electives, One-credit courses, Online courses, Value-added courses/ Add-on courses, Self-study electives, Life skills, Mini-project, Personality Development Modules Layer-learning or learning-by-doing, Technical seminar and Summer / Winter Internships are some of the features of the Autonomous Curriculum.
- Science Electives, Language Electives, Mathematics Electives, Entrepreneurship Electives, SAP (Systems, Applications and Products in Data Processing) Electives and Electives on Management topics are some more unique features of the Autonomous System.
- Two dimensional approach (cognitive and knowledge domains) is followed in the classroom delivery and evaluation with learner-centric approach.
- Evaluation process, under the Autonomous System, includes continuous assessment in the form of quiz, online tests, surprise tests, library based assignments, open book tests, term papers, seminar presentations and field study.
- Announcement of results within a week after the last examination, supplementary examinations and special supplementary examinations are conducted before the commencement of succeeding Semester.
- Periodic feedback through structured rubrics is also obtained on all the taught courses for academic improvement.

Learning Centre

Five storeyed, air-conditioned and fully automated Learning Centre (8240 sq.m. / 88,662 sq.ft.) provides the teaching and learning support of 89,000 volumes of text and reference books facilitated by OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) RFID based Library Management System. Besides, Learning Centre subscribes 400 National and International Journals and 6184 e-journals that includes IEL, SCOPUS, Elsevier - Science Direct, ASCE, ASME, Springer, Mc-Grawhill- Access Engineering, J-Gate and ProQuest publications. An exclusive Digital Library houses 96 Google - Chrome Base for accessing on-line journals, NPTEL, NITTT&R and other Open Source courseware.

Guidelines and Rules

1. All the books are affixed RFID tags for identification. Users are requested not to tamper or mutilate the RFID tag. If the tag is damaged, the return of the book will not be authorized and the user has to pay a penalty of ₹ 500/-

3. Books borrowed must be returned on the due date. Failure to do so shall attract penalty as follows:
First day ₹ 5/-
From second day onwards ₹1/- per day is to be paid additionally.
In the case of CD / DVD / cassettes, ₹ 5 per day

4. Renewal of borrowing is allowed for one subsequent time if the particular book is not reserved by other users.
5. Renewal of borrowing can be done through online (CAMPS- Students portal) also.
6. RFID Cards are not transferable. Hence, the students are advised to borrow books by using their own cards only.
7. The library users are advised to check the due date through the students web portal and no separate reminders will be sent to the individual defaulters.
8. Users will get acknowledgement slip for their issue & return transactions. In addition, they will get SMS for their transaction.
9. Before borrowing the books, students must ensure that the book is in good condition and pages are intact. Defects must be brought to the notice of the Librarian. Otherwise, the borrower is liable to be held responsible.
10. No user shall deface the library books by underlining or scribbling notes in the margins.
11. Loss of books issued should be reported to the Librarian immediately.
12. If the borrower is unable to replace the lost book by another good copy, the user has to pay the current price of the book in double along with over due charges.
13. Journals, Magazines and Project Reports shall not be issued.
14. Personal books and files should be handed over to the attendant in the Property Counter at the entrance of Learning Centre. Plain sheets / Notebooks may be taken instead. Students are advised not to keep their valuable things in the Learning Centre. Learning Centre authorities are not responsible for any loss of such items.
15. Silence is to be maintained in the Learning Centre. Those who violate are first warned and then they are asked to leave the Learning Centre.

Academic Resource Cell (ARC)

Academic Resource Cell has been established in the Institute to implement new initiatives related to teaching-learning, coordinate the preparation of lesson plans, provide the relevant training to the members of faculty of all the Departments, and monitor the effective conduct of the classes.

Anti-Ragging

(Curbing the menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions (third amendment), Regulations, 2009 dated 17 June 2009) UGC Notification dated 29 June 2016.

Various measures have been taken by the Institute to prohibit any conduct by any student(s), orally or written form or by an act which has the effect that constitute(s) any actions defined as ragging, as per the Notification / Regulation issued by UGC, preventing its occurrence and punishing those who indulge in ragging as provided in the Regulations of UGC and the appropriate law in force. Anti-Ragging Committee and Anti-ragging Squad take care of implementing such measures effectively in the Campus.

Community Radio

The Bannari Amman community radio station was established in the campus with a view to benefit students and people from local community. Computing Facilities

There are more than 2600 desktops with Core 2 Duo, Quad core, i5 and i7 processors with the capacity for designing, drafting, analysis and multimedia application. BIT is one of the few Higher Learning Institutions to have Grid and Cloud Computing facility.

Co-operative Store

The students and the members of faculty of the Institution can become members of the Co-operative store by depositing an amount of ₹105/- The store meets the day-to-day requirements of both faculty and students.

Extra-Curricular Activities

In order to enrich the experience of the students and develop useful skills that otherwise one may not get exposure to, NCC, NSS and Sports facilities have been created in the campus. Besides, 50 different clubs organise different programmes, events and competitions to motivate the students and demonstrate their skills. The students are encouraged to become members of any one or more clubs and improve their skills and attitudes.

Friend of Friendless (FoF) Scheme

In order to help the financially needy fellow students, all the students contribute ₹10/- per month to the Friend-of-Friendless Scheme. The amount is collected and deposited in the bank and at the time of fee payment announcement, an advisory Board is constituted to assess the requirements of the students on need basis and financial assistance for the deserving students are provided. In addition to the students' contribution, the Management also contributes an equal sum to the students' contribution towards this Scheme. However, preference is given to the students who excel in the academic results.

Grievances and Redressal Committee

The Grievances and Redressal Committee desires to promote and maintain a conducive and unprejudiced educational environment.

Guidelines for Industrial Visits / Field Trips / Educational Tours

The safety of students in and outside the campus of the Institute is a matter of paramount importance. A safe learning climate is an ineluctable precondition to quality education and research. Internal Quality Assurance Cell

Internal Complaints Committee (ICC)

Internal Complaints Committee has been formed with senior lady faculty member as a Presiding Officer, 2 faculty, 2 non-teaching staff, 3 students (if students are involved) and one representative from an NGO to avoid unwanted conduct with sexual undertones, if it occurs or which is persistent and which demeans, humiliates or creates a hostile and intimidating environment or is calculated to induce submission by actual or threatened adverse consequences and includes any one more undesirable actions / circumstances. Language Laboratory

A state-of-the-art Language Laboratory has been setup with a capacity to accommodate 120 students simultaneously with a built-up area of 5510.52 sq.ft. The features of the Language Lab include:

The campus provides everything a student needs for leisure management and entertainment. The Institution caters to a wide range of sports including Badminton, Basketball, Cricket, Hockey and Football.

Indoor facilities are provided in the Student Centre in addition to Shuttle and Badminton courts in the quadrangle of the students' hostels. Two Synthetic Tennis Courts and two Synthetic Basketball Courts are also available.

Medical Facilities

A well-equipped Medical Centre is available in the campus. Dr.V Sandhya and Dr. M. S. Soundararajan have been appointed as Resident Medical Officers to take care of the welfare of the students round the clock. In case of emergency, ambulance service is readily available for 24 hours to access the medical facilities in the hospitals located at Sathyamangalam / Coimbatore / Erode.

Mentoring and Counseling System

Each student is attached to a member of faculty for guidance and advice. The students are advised to meet their respective faculty counsellors every week and discuss their progress and problems. The members of faculty offer guidance on academic, personal, social problems, and to bring out overall development among the students. Besides, two professional Welfare Officers are also available to provide counseling to the students.

NBA Cell

Accreditation Cell was formed during the academic year 2013-14. As a part of the cell, National Board of Accreditation (NBA) Model Centre was established. The aim of the cell is to organize training programmes in association with NBA, New Delhi to create awareness on Outcome Based Education, train the Resource Persons and Evaluators for Outcome Based Accreditation (OBA) process.

Networking & Internet Access Facility

A 1Gbps dedicated leased line 1:1 has been provided to the students. In addition, a campus intranet facility that comprises Intranet web services, mail services, file sharing, print services and database services. Entire campus is networked with optical fiber cable (OFC). Wi-Fi facility has been provided in all the academic blocks and hostels.

Residential Facilities

Well-furnished hostels for gents and ladies with four, double and single occupancy rooms are available with separate guest rooms. The living rooms are built with aesthetic layout, containing wardrobe and storage space. The dining halls with a seating capacity of 4100 students are available. Well planned and equipped servicing counters, highly modernised kitchen, a cold storage and dish washing machine form a part of residential functions. Semi-furnished quarters are available for the members of faculty inside the campus. Student Centre of the Institution is certified for the 5S Work Place Management System. Separate dining and rest room facilities are available for the day scholars in the cafeteria block and lunch to all the students are provided on all working days.

Scholarships and Loans

Applications for the following scholarships should be submitted with necessary certificates in the prescribed form to the Principal within 15 days from the date of reopening of the institution or admission of the candidate in the Institution:

1. Adi Dravidar Welfare Scholarship

Students belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes, whose parents' or guardian's annual income does not exceed ₹ 2.5 lakhs, are eligible for award of this scholarship. In case of Government servant, the Annual Income is ₹ 2 lakhs (only basic pay and DA will be taken into account). In addition to the above, a Special Scholarship of ₹ 8000 per year is also available.

2. Backward & Most Backward Classes Welfare Scholarship

Students belonging to the Backward Classes and whose parents' or guardian's income does not exceed ₹ 2,00,000 per annum are eligible for award of the scholarship. In the case of State Government employees, the basic pay only will be taken into account.

3. Tamilnadu Educational Trust Scholarship

Meritorious students belonging to Backward and Most Backward Classes are eligible for award of this scholarship.

4. National Merit Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to meritorious students based on the rank secured by them. The scholarship is renewed every successive year.

5. Chief Minister's Award

This award is given for SC/ST students who have scored higher marks in the Higher Secondary Examination by the Department of Adi-Dravidar Welfare, Chennai.

6. Special Merit Scholarship

This scholarship is awarded to the SC/ST students who have scored 60% (overall) and above in the Higher Secondary Examination.

7. Technical Scholarship-Department of Telecommunication

This scholarship is awarded to the wards of staff who are working in the Department of Telecommunication on the basis of merit (at least 60% for technical courses).

8. Alumni Scholarship

Alumni members of Textile Technology and Electrical & Electronics offer scholarships to the needy students on annual basis.

Software Development Cell (SDC)

Software Development Cell is established in BIT to develop software products and solutions to meet the institution & societal needs. The focus of the group includes

- To develop innovative enterprise software product for campus management seamlessly integrated with Google Cloud
- To train students in the area of enterprise application developments, mobile apps development and cloud technologies
- To conduct research on open source firewall technologies to provide security solutions
- To conduct research in open stack platform and establishing BIT private cloud

Transport Facility

The Institution has 26 buses for the benefit of the day scholars and the members of the faculty commuting from within a radical distance of 100 kms to the Institute on all working days. The bus facilities are utilised for local visits and educational trips. Besides, one 14-seater van (air-conditioned), 10 LCVs are also available to bring the experts for guest lectures.

Training and Placement

The college emphasizes on appropriate training throughout the academic career of the students and effective placement at the end of the programme. Life skill courses (Quantitative Aptitude, Verbal Aptitude and Technical) are offered as a part of curriculum to all the students. External vendors are also engaged for such purposes. The Training and Placement (T&P) Cell has a full-time Placement Officer, Industrial Relations Officer, Assistant Placement Officer, five Aptitude trainers, five Verbal trainers and two Technical trainers. The T&P Cell is equipped with seminar halls, rooms for conducting group discussion and interview process. The T&P Cell maintains a comprehensive database of the students ready for campus interview and organizes placements through on-campus as well as off-campus processes.

Yoga

BIT offers Diploma in Yoga to all first year B.E/B.Tech students from World Community Service Centre, Aliyar. It helps them physically be fit and more focused on studies. They are able to commune with people very easily understanding self and others. In today's scenario, social skill is one of the most important employability skills. Advanced yoga is offered as one credit course in the second year by which students acquire self-confidence to face critical challenges in life.

RULES & REGULATIONS

1.0 DRESS CODE

- 1.1 All students shall wear neat, clean formal dress and shoes. Girls shall wear shalwar kameez / churidar. Boys shall wear trouser and shirt.
- 1.2 Students shall attend the laboratory and workshop classes in the prescribed uniform only.
- 1.3 While playing games or participating in sports, boys shall wear only shorts, vests or jersey and canvas shoes. Girls may wear appropriate dress and canvas shoes.
- 1.4 During educational tour, the students shall wear a formal dress that will befit the culture and the background of the Institution.
- 1.5 Students found violating the dress code will be sent out of the class by the members of faculty concerned and also the matter shall be brought to the notice of the Class Advisor/HOD for necessary action.

2.0 IDENTITY CARD

- 2.1 Every student admitted to the Institute will have to wear the Identity Card attached to lanyard on neck always, issued by the Institution. Day Scholars are given ID cards with Maroon Lanyard and inmates of the Hostels are given ID cards with Blue Lanyard. They must wear it all the time in the campus. The card with the lanyard must be surrendered at the time of leaving the Institute.
- 2.2 A student who has lost his / her Identity Card may submit a written request to the Principal for a duplicate Identity Card along with a payment of Rs. 500/- each.

3.0 ATTENDANCE, LEAVE AND PUNCTUALITY

- 3.1 Attendance requirements for appearing in the end semester examinations are governed as per the Regulations.
- 3.2 Students are allowed to apply for leave only on valid reasons. Applications for leave in case of illness / important family function should be addressed and submitted to the Head of the Department through the Class Adviser. The leave letter / E-mail should comprise the following particulars: (1) Name (2) Roll Number (3) Duration of leave and (4) Reason. Students should realize that the aim of such strict regulations is only to make understand ethical practices regularly in availing leave.
- 3.3 Students who go out for project work should take the prescribed attendance sheet with them from the department concerned, which is to be duly filled in and signed by an appropriate authority at the place of their project work. The attendance sheet should be submitted to the Institute on return without fail.

- 3.4 Students are required to be regular and punctual in attending the classes. In the classroom, everyone is expected to follow the proper classroom etiquette.

4.0 CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

- 4.1 As a responsible member of the Institute, every student should maintain high standard of discipline, courtesy and behaviour both inside and outside the campus. Students are also expected to set an example through poise, politeness, harmony and integrity both inside and outside the Institute. Reports of complaints on behavioural lapses or indiscipline from teaching and non-teaching staff or from the public would be viewed seriously. Students are expected to behave politely and in courteous manner towards the Staff.
- 4.2 A Disciplinary Committee is constituted with a view to manage students' discipline efficiently and effectively. The Disciplinary Committee shall have the power to directly call for an enquiry into any event that might influence or affect other students' discipline on and off the campus. They can summon any student(s) to appear before them in relation to an enquiry into any issue related to student discipline.
- 4.3 Students are required to give an undertaking at the time of joining the Institute to abstain from eve-teasing, quarrelling, smoking, use of alcoholic drinks, drugs, playing cards and indulging in any other undesirable activities. Those who indulge in such activities will attract disciplinary action such as suspension / expulsion or as per the guidelines of the University. Indulging or supporting malpractice and misbehaviour will be considered undesirable and will be viewed seriously.
- 4.4 Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited. If any information is received about any student involved in any form of ragging, he/ she will be expelled / dismissed from the Institute forthwith. Students are advised to take note of the Standing Government Order in this regard, which has been displayed prominently in the Institute notice boards.
- 4.5 Students shall avoid saying / doing anything by word or deed that may disturb the unity and harmony of life not only in the Institute and Hostel but also outside the campus. Students should strictly desist from (i) use of rude language towards the staff of the Institute / Hostel (ii) assaulting or attempting to assault the staff or fellow students of the Institution.
- 4.6 Students are forbidden from counseling or taking part in strikes and demonstrations (political / religious), In the premises of the Institute or Hostel. No meeting of any kind or get-together shall be arranged in the Institute premises or outside without the permission of the Principal.

- 4.7 During the class hours, students are forbidden from loitering along the corridors or disturb other classes at work. Any violation will be viewed seriously.
- 4.8 Bursting of crackers, applying colour powder or sprinkling colour water on others is forbidden within the Institution campus, hostel and during educational tours.
- 4.9 Disciplinary action on students who violate any of the rules and regulations will include anyone or more of the following as decided by the Disciplinary Committee:
- i. Fine
 - ii. Suspension from attending the classes for a specific number of days. Such suspension period will be treated as days of absence.
 - iii. Expulsion / Dismissal from Institute and / or Hostel.
- 4.10 No notice of any kind shall be circulated / pasted on the notice boards /walls by the student (s) without prior written permission from the Principal / HOD.
- 4.11 Use or possession of mobile phones is strictly banned in the academic area, All the students, including Day scholars are not allowed to keep mobile phones in their possession during the entire period of stay in the academic area. They shall deposit the mobile phones with the Security Guards at the entrance and collect them back while leaving the campus.
- 5.0 UPKEEP, CLEANLINESS AND SAFETY**
- 5.1 Students shall strictly observe the safety regulations in the laboratories and workshops.
- 5.2 Care should be exercised in handling the properties of the Institute and any damage caused casually or wantonly will entail disciplinary / penal action and recovery of cost.
- 5.3 Students are prohibited from defacing or damaging any building or furniture or any asset or property of the Institution. The cost of any damage so caused will be recovered along with fine from the students concerned or collectively if responsibility for it cannot be fixed on any individual, besides the disciplinary action.
- 5.4 Students are advised to switch off the fans and lights when they leave the classrooms.

- 5.5 Tea / Coffee / Snacks and any other refreshments served in the quadrangle should be taken within the quadrangle area and dispose the used coffee / tea cups or plates in the receptacle only. Students who violate this rule will be subjected to disciplinary action.

6.0 FUNCTIONS AND MEETINGS

- 6.1 Students are advised to actively participate in all the functions and meetings held in the Institution. When the students are called for attending such functions or meetings, no student should stay back in the hostels and they are expected to leave the hostels well in advance, so as to reach the venue in time. They shall maintain perfect discipline and order while attending the functions/ meetings. As soon as the function is over, the students should disperse immediately.
- 6.2. Students should not convene any separate farewell party either inside or outside the campus.
- 6.3. Students are expected not to leave in the middle of the proceedings of any meeting and not to be seen in any place other than the meeting venue.
- 6.4. they are expected to leave the hostels well in advance, so as to reach the Graduation Day, College Day, Hostel Day, and Sports Day, Inter-collegiate competitions, Association Meetings and Guest Lectures, Inaugural / Valedictory functions of various Seminars / Workshops / Conferences, etc.
- 6.5. They are also advised to refrain from sitting on the pavement / stairs.
- 6.6. Outsiders should not be invited to any function without the written permission of the Principal.

7.0 GENERAL

- 7.1 Requests, petitions, appeals and complaints of any kind need to be made in the first place to the Class Advisor / Head of the Department concerned and not directly to the higher authorities.
- 7.2 In all academic or disciplinary matters, decision of the authorities of the Institution shall be final.
- 7.3 Students are expected to read the notices put up on the notice boards or sent through emails.
- 7.4 Dayscholars should park their vehicles only in the parking lots.

- 7.5 Principal / Hostel authorities have the power to frame and issue additional / amended rules and regulations for proper conduct of proceedings inside and outside the Institute and / or hostel premises from time to time.

8.0 TIPS FOR GOOD MANNERS / CONDUCT

- 8.1 Do refrain from hurting others by words or deeds and do maintain self-discipline in all your activities.
- 8.2 Do consider others as brothers and sisters, as an extension of your own self.
- 8.3 Do keep your rooms, surroundings and the campus clean and tidy.
- 8.4 Do participate in all the institutional activities in the campus enthusiastically.
- 8.5 Do refrain from smoking and consuming any intoxicants. It injures you and also others, physically and mentally.
- 8.6 Do consider the whole campus as yours, and hence refrain from any activities harmful and destructive.
- 8.7 Do respect your teachers and all other staff members of the Institute. Respect given begets respect.
- 8.8 Exchange of greetings with members of faculty in the Institute and Hostels enhances smooth relationship with them.
- 8.9 Above all, the whole campus is yours. After you leave, generations of students will have to use these facilities. Leave the campus as a better place for them. Make the best use of all the facilities for a successful future in your chosen field and for your personal development so that you can contribute to the development of the Nation.

9.0 GUIDELINES TO THE PARENTS / GUARDIANS

- 9.1 Education is a joint responsibility. The parents and the members of faculty have to co-operate and co-ordinate their efforts in order to train the students on proper lines to maintain discipline and to inculcate diligence, honesty and courtesy among students. Parents are therefore requested to extend their full co-operation to the Institute authorities in all matters.
- 9.2. Separate visitors' cards are given to the parents, which they need to produce, essentially, in the security gate while visiting their wards.
- 9.3. The parents can meet the Principal / Heads of the Departments on any working day with prior appointment to obtain information on their wards' academic performance.
- 9.4. Change of address of parents should be promptly intimated to the Institution in writing.
- 9.5. Whenever the presence of parents / guardians is needed, they shall be present in the Institute at the request of the Institute authorities.

HOSTEL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1.0 MANAGEMENT OF THE HOSTEL

- 1.1 The Chairman of the Institute is the Patron. The Principal is the Warden. They are vested with power to interpret and enforce the rules. The Senior Deputy Wardens and Deputy Wardens will assist the Warden.
- 1.2 The Hostel Council consisting of hostel authorities and student representatives will meet periodically to review the hostel activities inclusive of mess menu and make suggestions for improvement.

2.0 ADMISSION

- 2.1 Application for admission to the hostel must be made in the prescribed form. Admission is subject to the approval of the Warden.
- 2.2 Admission to the hostel does not confer any absolute right of residence. Any resident may be asked to vacate the hostel at any time if circumstances so warrant. Admission ordinarily entitles the resident to reside in the hostel during the period when the Institute is in session.
- 2.3 Admission is to be made afresh every year in the case of all residents who desire to reside in the hostel. Renewal of admission is necessary.
- 2.4 Every student before being admitted to the hostel shall give an undertaking in writing that the student will abide by the rules and regulations of the hostel duly signed by the student and parent / guardian.
- 2.5 Students admitted to the hostel shall be full boarders of the hostel. The authorities may close down any or all dining halls during vacation or other periods.
- 2.6 All the inmates are required to wear their ID Cards while entering the hostel and dining hall. No student will be allowed to enter the hostel or dining hall without the ID Card.

3.0 HOSTEL FEES

- 3.1 Before admission, each student has to pay admission fee, mess fee, establishment and other charges which may be revised from time to time.
- 3.2 In addition to the above, the residents shall share the expenses incurred towards the salary paid to the hostel staff, electricity and water charges and maintenance of the hostel premises and dining halls.

4.0 CLEANLINESS IN THE HOSTEL

- 4.1 Residents are responsible for the cleanliness of the rooms, corridors, etc.
- 4.2 All waste papers and garbage must be placed in the receptacle specially provided for this purpose.
- 4.3 The students including days scholars and girls, who want to go out during regular class/lab hours, tea/ lunch interval, they should also enter the details regular class/lab hours, tea/ lunch interval, they should also enter the details regular class/lab hours, tea/ lunch interval, they should also enter the details register.
- 4.4 Inmates need to make responsible efforts to maintain proper personal cleanliness and hygiene.

5.0 ROOMS

- 5.1 Students will be allotted rooms at the discretion of the Warden. If any found in resident may be asked to vacate the hostel at any time if circumstances so laptops, desktop computers and tablets with headphones are allowed with prior permission. It should not be used during the Study Hours.
- 5.4 Extra lamps and other electrical appliances are not permitted. If any found in played inside the rooms or along the corridors.

6.0 FURNITURE AND HOSTEL PROPERTY

- 6.1 Each room is provided with Tables, Chairs, Wardrobes, Dustbins and disciplinary action and in addition, may be required to pay rent for both the authorities may close down any or all dining halls during vacation or other locking the table drawer.

- 6.2 Residents shall not tamper or damage furniture electrical fittings and any property of the hostel. Any damage to the hostel property including driving nails and defacing of walls, pasting papers or posters, fixtures or furniture will be made good cost of occupants, besides disciplinary action.

7.0 DISCIPLINE

- 7.1 Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited. Those who found guilty of ragging Extra lamps and other electrical appliances are not permitted. If any found in Institute immediately.
- 7.2 authorities the furniture allotted to them in the same condition as they were / Deputy Warden / Hostel Manager.

- 7.9 Conducting meetings/ birthday celebrations are not permitted in the hostels.

- 7.10 Extra lamps and other electrical appliances are not permitted. If any found in masala, Areca nut (beetal nut) and its by-products are prohibited in the hostel /hostel premises/ college premises.
- 7.11 Consumption/ possession of alcoholic beverages are prohibited in the hostels or premises. Inmates are not allowed to enter the hostel / premises in intoxicated state. Anyone found indulging in such things will be asked to vacate the hostel as well as be rusticated from the college.
- 7.12 The use, possession, manufacture, sale, or distribution of drugs or narcotics at any location, whether in or near the community is illegal; it is the responsibility of the students to notify the authorities if he/she suspects a room-mate engaged in such illegal activities. All the room-mates are equally responsible if any such substances are found in their rooms. If anyone found indulging in such activities will have to face disciplinary action.
- 7.13 Crackers are not permitted either in hostels /college premises.
- 7.14 All the students are requested to wear the college ID card when they go out of the hostel premises and they are supposed to show their cards if necessary.
- 7.15 The inmates are directed not to exhibit any notice / brochures / pamphlets at the hostel / mess notice board without the permission of the Senior Warden.
- 7.16 A prior permission is to be obtained in the form of writing from the Senior Deputy Warden / Deputy Warden for using laptop / desktop. An under taking form needs to be submitted that the system will be used for educational purpose only. While taking the system in / out, necessary entries should be made at the Hostel Gate / College Security Gate.
- 7.17 The hostel corridors and the rooms must be kept clean and tidy all times, including proper disposal of food and beverage containers. Inmates are prohibited from activities that violate any health code.
- 7.18 Inmates are not permitted to change the allotted rooms without obtaining written permission from the Senior Deputy Warden.
- 7.19 The inmates should not engage themselves in any unnecessary conversation, discussion, quarrel or altercation with hostel staff / other staff. If there is any complaint, it is to be lodged with the Deputy Warden / Hostel Manager / Senior Deputy Warden. Use of abusive, vulgar or unparliamentary words against the staff is strictly forbidden.
- 7.20 Gambling in any form is strictly prohibited.
- 7.21 Dining hall furniture, utensils and food are not to be taken out of the dining hall. However food for the sick person can be carried with written permission from the Deputy Warden / Hostel Manager/ Senior Deputy Warden.
- 7.22 The inmates shall behave properly in the dining hall and follow proper dress code. They are advised to wear clean clothes covering the knees and arm pits.

- 7.23 Pet animals are not permitted in the hostels / dining
- 7.24 Inmates are instructed to register any complaint regarding electrical / plumbing / room maintenance, in the complaint register which is available at the security gates of the respective hostels. The inmates have to hand over the room key to the Supervisor / Caretaker concerned, who looks into the complaints.
- 7.25 If there is any serious issue, it has to be brought to the knowledge of Senior Deputy Warden / Hostel Manager / Caretaker / Supervisor / Security immediately.
- 7.26 Parents are permitted to visit the hostel only between 6 AM and 6 PM. (including holidays)
- 7.27 Inmates are directed to deposit their luggage at the hostel cloak rooms during summer vacation.
- 7.28 Inmates shall register their bio-metric attendance between 7.45pm.to 9.15pm.on all days including the holidays. If they failed to register, then class attendance from the next day will be blocked.
- 7.29 Usage of Mobile phones is restricted during study hours and silent hour's i.e.8.30pm to 6.00am. (Including holidays)
- 7.30 Outing is permitted for boys on Tuesdays and Thursdays and for girls on Wednesdays and Fridays. They are given buffer limit 45 (minutes) after outing time for whole semester. If the buffer limit gets exceeded, then class attendance from the next day will be blocked. For 1st year outing permission is after 2nd semester onwards.
- 7.31 warrant. Admission ordinarily entitles the resident to reside in the hostel whenever necessary.

8.0 GUESTS

- 8.1 Guests are governed by the same rules of discipline, as applicable to the students. Residents will be held responsible for their guests not adhering to the rules and regulations of the hostel.

9.0 GENERAL

- 9.1 Students residing in the hostels are to bear in mind that the rules are framed with the sole intention of providing a congenial atmosphere for academic studies and recognized extra-curricular activities. Hence, they are requested to co-operate with the administration to make their stay happy and memorable and devote the time to equip themselves for a glorious future.
- 9.2 Resident faculty will counsel the inmates of hostel between 7.30 p.m. and 9.00 p.m. on all working days (except Saturdays) in the counseling rooms of the hostel. Students are advised to avail this facility to sort out their academic / personal problems.
- 9.3 Residents shall furnish details of their home address, telephone number, and the names and correct addresses of parents / guardians at the time of admission and should notify promptly any change of address.

- 9.4 The hostel authorities cannot be held responsible for any loss or theft of the belongings of the residents. The residents must make their own authorities may close down any or all dining halls during vacation or other warrant. Admission ordinarily entitles the resident to reside in the hostel rooms.
- 9.5 Everyone should remember the importance of conserving electric power and water. Lights and fans should be switched off when not needed. Taps in the nails and defacing of walls, pasting papers or posters, fixtures or furniture will found by anyone should be reported to the Deputy Wardens / hostel authorities immediately for taking remedial action.
- 9.6 regular class/lab hours, tea/ lunch interval, they should also enter the details nails and defacing of walls, pasting papers or posters, fixtures or furniture will Warden. The Warden shall decide any matter not covered by the rules, as and when required.
